

# The Plan of Action towards Quality Enhancement

The IQAC, Tyagbir Hem Baruah College has chalked out the following programmes in the beginning of the year 2009 towards quality enhancement.

# A. Plan of action during 2009-2010

The following initiatives have been taken to fulfill the proposed plan during 2009-10:

- i. Construction of a well furnished Principal's Chamber with Internet facility is on process.
- ii. The Dept. of Zoology and Economics organized two National Seminars sponsored by the UGC.
- iii. Different Depts. of the college organized Departmental Seminars to encourage the students of the college in different areas of the subject.
- iv. Introduction of functional and spoken English course is on process.
- v. Establishment of a zoological museum in the Department of Zoology is on process.
- vi. Construction of a girls common room with attached facilities like, drinking water, toilet etc. is on official process.
- vii. Renovation of a part of the old classrooms, auditorium, play ground etc. has already been completed.
- viii. A maximum number of teachers have started research activities in their respective areas.

- ix. The department of Zoology organized several NEAC programmes in different localities of the Naduar area with financial support of Assam Science Society, Guwahati.
- x. 'International Wetland Day' was observed on 2<sup>nd</sup> February 2010 at Jamugurihat, organized by the Dept. of Zoology in Collaboration of Suryoday Gosthi, an NGO of Sonitpur district.
- xi. Construction of boundary wall around the college campus in a phase-wise manner (on process, but delayed due to proposed transfer of NH 52 into 4-lane).
- xii. Construction of a well furnished boys' hostel is on process.
- xiii. Extension of existing tea garden for generating funds for the college.
- xiv. Development of in-campus link road (on process).

# B. Infrastructure development

New equipments are purchased in the laboratories of the following Departments.

- ii. Two 3 x 8 sq. mt. cycle stand and bike stands were constructed.
- iii. In case of student transportation facilities initiative was taken but yet the problem remain unsolved. But process of negotiation is ongoing with the Transport Authority of Sonitpur district.
- iv. The process of construction of boundary walls was delayed due to the process of conversion of NH 52 (adjacent to the college campus) to a four lane Highway, as it was apprehended that it might lead to demolition of the walls adjacent to the highway.
- v. Old college building was renovated for boys' hostel for SC/ST students from remote area and foot-hills of Arunachal Pradesh boarder of Assam.
- vi. About 0.75 acre of land is prepared for extension of tea plantation.
- vii. Link-roads of sand gravel and bricks were prepared. Additional fund for link road construction was provided by the Gaon Panchayat and Mahakuma Parisad.

# C. Academic development

- i. Internal assessment of 10 marks in each paper for every student of TDC 1<sup>st</sup> year, TDC 2<sup>nd</sup> year and TDC 3<sup>rd</sup> year was implemented with the direction of Gauhati University. Two Unit-test exams, each of 12 marks, were conducted by each department of the college. Attendance of each student was well calculated for the same.
- Tutorial and Remedial classes were conducted in the Department of English and by the Science faculty.
- iii. Multi-Gymnasium is well administered with the help of a local NGO for the development of physical health of the student as well as youth of the locality.

  - b. PG course in Political Science, History, Economics, Assamese, English, Mathematics & Commerce through Institute of Distance and Open Learning (IDOL) Contact Centre, Gauhati University.

# 3. Innovations in curricular design and transaction:

The syllabi of the UG (Major and General) courses are provided by the Gauhati University. However, the syllabi of the COP are based on the needs and local conditions of the area and the same are prepared by the concerned course coordinator and are approved by the Gauhati University.

# 4. Initiation of inter-disciplinary programmes:

The COP and various computer courses offered by the computer education centre of the college are being undertaken by the students from both Arts and Science streams.

### 5. Examination reforms initiated:

Steps are being undertaken to introduce Semester System at UG level and is supposed to come into effect from the session 2011-12.

For feedback on teachers, data had been collected from students using 10 point scale from different departments. For this, the feedback forms were distributed to the students of different departments depending on the students' strength of the respective departments. By analyzing feedback forms, it has been found that the average rank of the teachers of the college ranges from 6.73 to 9.27 in different departments. It also reveals that the average rankings on the attribute no.-3 (Ability to integrate course material with environment) and attribute no.-7 (Provision of sufficient timely feedback) are relatively high. Students' response on teachers' communication skill, interest generation, sincerity and commitment is found to be quite encouraging.

## Action taken on students' feedback

Different steps have been taken by the college authority for improvement of teachers' efficiency. The teachers are allowed to participate in refresher courses, orientation courses, workshops, seminars etc. Award to the best department was also given based on the performance of students in the degree final year result to encourage the teachers.
