The College Environment and Climate Cell of T.H.B. College, in collaboration with the Extension Cell, organized an awareness programme on February 28, 2024, at Amdara High School. The event aimed to educate students from classes IX to XII about the detrimental effects of superstitious beliefs on society.

Dr. Tulsi Upadhyaya, the Coordinator of the College Environment and Climate Cell, emphasized the importance of addressing superstition, noting its negative impact on social behavior and decision-making.
